

PLAN Score Report Interpretation

Your student should bring home three documents related to the PLAN score report—the report sheet, the test booklet and a copy of “Using Your PLAN Results”.

I will point out the items of greatest significance in the report:

Composite Score: Based on a scale of 1-32

This is an average of the four subtest scores:

English
Math
Reading
Science

Your Estimated ACT score: Projected based on PLAN performance

Composite & Subtest Scores are reported in four formats:

Numerical (1-32)

Your score compared to all in the US who took it in
both percentage and bar graph format

Your score compared to others at Lorena High
School who took the test

Your plans: I see some misinterpretation of the instructions in this area. The gray bar should represent the coursework your student has taken and also plans to take. Many only marked the ones taken and in progress.

College Readiness: This is an important section. The subtest scores in this section need to be compared to your student’s subtest scores in the first section. The numbers in the blue bars of the college readiness section represent the standard that has been set for students who are in the 10th grade and who plan to pursue higher education. The “checks” in the boxes indicate whether your student is on target at this point in terms of level of preparation.

Your skills—on back side of score report document

Used in conjunction with your test booklet, this is an itemized analysis so that the student can identify academic weaknesses and remediate those prior to taking the ACT.
